2. BORD AND EXECUTIVE REPORT

2.1 Advanced Education, Apprenticeship and Student Aid Update – Andy Weiler

The Assistant Deputy Minister provided an update on the 2019/2020 budget, introduced in late October. This update included changes to the tuition fee regulation, budget pressures facing the system, and the overall fiscal constraint of government.

2.2 Board Chair's Report

The board chair reported on the industry and government events and meetings she has attended since the last board meeting.

2.3 Board Members' Reports

Board members reported that they participated in industry events and meetings since the last board meeting including board standing committee meetings and a number of PAC/OC meetings as Board Liaisons.

Board members were also asked to give an update on their industries. Most industries are looking at new work and an improvement to the employment rate. Some, however, still struggle.

Policy and Standards

- The Executive Director provided an update on the platform commitments, an update from the recent Canadian Council of Directors of Apprenticeship meeting (CCDA) and an update on ESDC initiatives.
- The Executive Director provided more specifics to changes within Ontario as they were provided in jurisdictional update to CCDA. OCOT (Ontario College of Trades) closing in Fall 2020 -. Still plan to align with harmonization, but not sure how that will look.
- Executive Director will provide three pieces of information to Board members
 - Video of Premier Kenney's speech on the skilled trades at the Skills Canada Alberta funding media event
 - Ontario CCDA update on changes to Ontario Skilled Trades legislation
 - News release announcing the National Advisory Committee for Apprenticeship Promotion

Operations and Client Connections

- Year to date registrations for all apprentices
 - o 46,109 registrations in the last year; down 8% from previous year
 - o 11,076 new registrations in the last year; down 16% from previous year
 - o 6,669 completions in the last year; down 15% from previous year
 - o 10,492 cancellations in the last year; same as in previous year
- 2019 Compliance stats
 - o Total compliance orders services is 637
- There are about 5000 dormant apprentices in the system. Staff are incrementally working to address these. Cancelling about 400 per month to clean up the system.
- The new certificates and wallet cards were presented for information. The changes implemented will reduce the amount of time spent on each file by approximately 20 minutes.
- A new employer interface tool is currently being developed and should be introduced in the new year.

4.2 Industry Standards Committee Report

The Director, Industry Programs and Standards provided the following information related to the current fiscal situation:

- Going forward, the work the PAC's are doing will be implemented with an eye on budget and the costs involved to implement any changes.
- The PAC's will continue to be engaged but the recommendations and motions that incur additional costs will need to be reviewed against the budget constraints.
- Program changes that are currently under consideration (e.g. HET harmonization changes) are being paused until the department has the ability to review financial impacts and make recommendations on a path forward.
- It is incumbent upon the Board to ensure Industry is aware of these constraints and that everyone needs to be creative to continue moving forward.

Freeman Willerton tabled a report on the November 15, 2019 meeting of the Industry Standards Committee (ISC) and the following motions:

• Rig Technician De-designation

Attendees were provided the background to the de-designation request and in light of the members request for more information regarding the position of the employees working in this industry, this debrief also presented the department's actions in communicating with the registered apprentices since the last ISC meeting. Details of the cancellation strategy were provided with data collected up to the time of this meeting. The department indicated that the response of those who made inquiries were primarily centered on means to achieve certification with very few indicating any concern for the potential end of the program itself. Of the approximately 700 individuals the department attempted to contact, the responses over the month long process numbered to the total of under 20.

• Hairstylist Duplicate Assessment

Attendees were informed about the Board's requirement for a practical examination for the hairstylist and welding apprenticeship programs and how this requirement is an anomaly for only these two programs in order to comply with the Red Seal national standards. The Hairstylist PAC had compared the results of the training providers required competency assessments and the examinations administered by the department. The PAC concluded that the assessments were almost identical and the training providers assessment outcomes were similar to the outcomes of the department assessment. Understanding that if the PAC maintains oversight of the training providers assessment, removing the requirement for a second examination would not jeopardize the awarding of the Red Seal endorsement the PAC made the recommendation to the Board to remove the requirement for a practical examination for those apprentices attending technical training.
