Definitions

- 1** In this Order,
- (a) "Act" means the Apprenticeship and Industry Training Act;
 - (b) "Board" means the Alberta Apprenticeship and Industry Training Board;
 - (c) "Executive Director" means the Executive Director appointed under section 14 of the Act.
 - (d) "sponsor" means a person in a designated occupation who has knowledge of and is able to verify the skills and work experience of a person in that occupation;
 - (e) "training program" means a program
 - (i) under which a person acquires skill and knowledge in a designated occupation, and
 - (ii) that is described in this Order.

Achievement of standards

- 2** The Board, in consultation with the applicable occupational committee
- (a) sets or recognizes the examinations that are required to measure the achievement of standards under this Order, and
 - (b) determines the standards that are to be achieved.

Requirements to complete a training program

- 3** To complete a training program, a person must
- (a) complete the term of the training program that is applicable to that person,
 - (b) successfully complete all required examinations, and
 - (c) with respect to work experience, be given a satisfactory report by the person's employer, supervisor or sponsor that the person has successfully completed the work experience requirements.

Term of construction craft worker training program

- 4** (1) Subject to credit for previous training or experience being granted by the Executive Director, the term of a training program in the construction craft worker occupation is a minimum of 12 months during which a person must
- (a) acquire at least 2000 hours of work experience, and
 - (b) successfully complete the formal training that is required or approved by the Board.
- (2) To enter a training program in the construction craft worker occupation, a person must have a minimum grade 9 education.

Term of field heat treatment technician training program

- 5** Subject to credit for previous training or experience being granted by the Executive Director, the term of a training program in the field heat treatment technician occupation is a minimum of 48 months during which a person must
- (a) acquire at least 7200 hours of work experience, and
 - (b) successfully complete the formal training that is required or approved by the Board.

Term of gas utility operator training program

- 6** Subject to credit for previous training or experience being granted by the Executive Director, the term of a training program in the gas utility operator occupation is a minimum of 24 months during which a person must
- (a) acquire at least 3400 hours of work experience and
 - (b) successfully complete the formal training that is required or approved by the Board.

Term of industrial construction crew supervisor training program

- 7** The term of a training program in the industrial construction crew supervisor occupation is a minimum of 24 consecutive

months within the 5 years prior to the date a person applies for certification, during which a person must

- (a) acquire at least 1000 hours of work experience, and
- (b) complete the formal training that is required or approved by the Board, or
- (c) demonstrate that the person has acquired the competencies recognized by the Board in the industrial construction crew supervisor occupation.

Term of residential construction site manager training program

8 The term of a training program in the residential construction site manager occupation is a minimum of 36 months during which a person must

- (a) acquire at least 4500 hours of work experience, and
- (b) successfully complete the formal training that is required or approved by the Board. [Board Order 4/2011]

Term of cathodic protection technician training program

8.1 (1) The term of a training program in the cathodic protection technician-level one occupation is a minimum of 12 cumulative months, during which a person must:

- (a) acquire at least 1000 hours of work experience, and
- (b) complete the formal training that is required or approved by the Board.

(2) The term of a training program in the cathodic protection technician-level two occupation is a minimum of 12 cumulative months, during which a person must:

- (a) acquire at least 1000 hours of work experience,
- (b) complete the formal training that is required or approved by the Board, and
- (c) produce evidence of cathodic protection technician-level one certification.

(3) Repealed [Board Order 3/2012, 16/2014]

8.2 Term of overhead door technician training program

(1) The term of a training program in the overhead door technician-level one occupation is a minimum of 12 months, during which a person must:

- (a) acquire at least 1000 hours of work experience, and
- (b) complete the formal training that is required or approved by the Board.

(2) The term of a training program in the overhead door technician-level two occupation is a minimum of 12 months, during which a person must:

- (a) acquire at least 1000 hours of work experience,
- (b) complete the formal training that is required or approved by the Board, and
- (c) produce evidence of overhead door technician-level one certification.

(3) Between January 1, 2015 and August 31, 2018, a person may apply for certification in the overhead door technician-level two occupation without evidence of overhead door technician - level one certification, but a person must:
(a) acquire at least 2000 hours of work experience over a minimum term of 24 months, and
(b) complete the formal training that is required or approved by the Board for level one and level two.

9 The Designated Occupations Training Order, Board Order 2/2000 is repealed.
