Interpretation

1 In this Order,

- (a) “apprentice” means a person who is an apprentice in a branch of the trade;
- (b) “certified journeyman” means a certified journeyman as defined in the *Apprenticeship Program Regulation*;
- (c) “existing apprentice” means a person who immediately before April 1, 2007 was an apprentice in the previous apprenticeship program;
- (d) “new apprenticeship program” means an apprenticeship program under the trade Regulation;
- (e) “previous apprenticeship program” means an apprenticeship program in the appliance service technician trade under the previous Regulation;
- (f) “previous Regulation” means the *Appliance Service Technician Trade Regulation* (AR 260/2000);
- (g) “technical training” means technical training as defined in the *Apprenticeship Program Regulation*;
- (h) “trade” means the occupation of appliance service technician that is designated as a compulsory certification trade pursuant to the *Apprenticeship and Industry Training Act*;
- (i) “trade Regulation” means the *Appliance Service Technician Trade Regulation*.

Existing apprentices

2 An existing apprentice must, subject to this Order, enter into one of the new apprenticeship programs.

Credit for existing apprentices

3 **(1)** An existing apprentice who had successfully complete the first or 2nd periods of apprenticeship in the previous apprenticeship program is to be given credit for having successfully completed the first or 2nd period of apprenticeship, as applicable, of the new apprenticeship program.

- (2) An existing apprentice who had not completed the first, 2nd or 3rd periods of apprenticeship is to be given credit for the technical training the apprentice had successfully completed and the hours of on the job training the apprentice had acquired in the apprentice's previous apprenticeship program.
- (3) Subject to credit being granted under subsections (1) and (2), an existing apprentice must successfully complete the requirements of the new apprenticeship program in the appliance service technician branch of the trade in order to be granted a trade certificate in that branch.
- (4) Subject to credit being granted under subsections (1) and (2), an existing apprentice must successfully complete the requirements of the new apprenticeship program in the commercial appliance service technician branch of the trade in order to be granted a trade certificate in that branch.

Credit for on the job training

- 4** In granting credit for on the job training for the purposes of this Order, the credit granted may be a lesser amount if the Executive Director is of the opinion that the lesser amount properly reflects the actual amount of on the job training that the existing apprentice had acquired in the branch of the trade in which the existing apprentice is continuing as an apprentice.

Existing trade certificates

- 5** A trade certificate granted in the appliance service technician trade before April 1, 2007 is equivalent to a trade certificate granted in the appliance service technician branch of the trade on or after April 1, 2007.

Coming into force

- 6** This Order comes into force on April 1, 2007.
