Automotive Service Technician Program Updates



Vehicles are changing fast – apprenticeship education for Automotive Service Technicians (AST) is keeping up.

- The updated AST curriculum will make sure Alberta's AST apprentices learn the skills needed on the job today and into the future.
- The changes also make sure Alberta's AST program is in line with Red Seal standards, making it easier for Alberta journeypersons to work anywhere in Canada.

Curriculum Updates

Here's a quick look at some of the key changes:

• 1st period:

- More training on vehicle hoist safety and use
- New information about trailers and trailer hitches
- o More focus on following maintenance schedules
- Introduction to HVAC system safety and recharging
- o Introduction to hybrid and electric vehicle safety

2nd period:

- o New section on gas metal arc welding
- More detail on transaxles, final drive gear set, and axle shafts and bearings

• 3rd period:

- More focus on vibration analysis
- New information on advanced driver assistance systems
- Added types of diagnostic tests

· 4th period:

- More training on diesel vehicles and transmissions
- New section on electric and hybrid vehicle control system diagnosis



Hours and Weeks Updates

Total program length is about the same, but how it's split between classroom and on-the-job hours is changing.

· Classroom Instruction:

o Increases from 8 weeks to 9 weeks each period.

• On-the-job hours:

- For new apprentices (starting August 29, 2025 or later):
- Decreases from 1,560 to 1,530 hours per year
- For current apprentices (starting before August 29, 2025):
 - No change. On-the-job hours remain at 1,560 per period.
- Apprentices keep their existing record book. No updates are required, and no progress is lost.

• Trades Qualifier - Work Experience Program:

- Hours: Decreasing from 9,360 to 9,180 (for applicants on or after August 29, 2025).
- Months: No change. Remains 72 months.

Timeline

- Periods 1 and 2 changes start in 2025/26 school year.
- Periods 3 and 4 changes start in the 2026/27 school year.
