Executive Summary

The My Skilled Trades Network (MySTN) is a network developed and maintained by Apprenticeship and Industry Training (AIT) in conjunction with the Alberta Board of Skilled Trades (ABST). MySTN was launched on November 1, 2023, and began accepting applications from individuals to join the database as Subject Matter Experts (SMEs) in one or more skilled trades. The primary purpose of the network is to ensure that AIT has the ability to engage with a broad spectrum of industry stakeholders to support both AIT and the ABST in their work as it pertains to apprenticeship training and the skilled trades in Alberta.

Between November 2023 and early April 2024, the MySTN Team developed MySTN's application verification process, managing the associated data and building the platform interface to better support database operations. During this phase, a minimal amount of requests for SMEs were processed resulting in minimal initial data.

The baseline structure of the MySTN request and consultation process started at the end of April 2024. This started with only a few requests and consultations with SMEs, as the new system was gradually made fully operational.

The full transition to using MySTN happened over Fall 2024. From that date until now, AIT uses MySTN for work requiring consultation with trade SMEs, now known as MySTN members.

Data provided for the 2024-2025 Academic year reflects some of the transition period and the solidifying of MySTN processes. Therefore, the data reflected may have higher numbers than presented and has no baseline on which to compare.






MySTN Member Demographics


MySTN Member Status in their Identified Trade(s)





















MySTN Member Representation

MySTN Member Distribution by AIT Office Region as of July 2025











MySTN Member Interest in Consultation Types

Consultations Per Month

There was a total of 215 consultations from August 2024 to July 2025.



Group and Individual Consultations

Group and individual consultations are usually grouped together, as their data normally aligns. However, for reporting purposes, their monthly counts are shown separately to reflect how each type of meeting was tracked. The number of individual consultations may be approximate, as many are connected to the Canadian Council of Directors of Apprenticeship (CCDA) Red Seal Program, which may not have specific dates.


Fill rate: These consultations have a specific number of spots available. On average, the fill rate for these spots is **69%.**

Group and individual consultations can be held in different ways: in-person, virtually or both (hybrid).




Surveys

The total number of invitations sent per month includes invitations to all consultation types.






Average Response & Attendance Rates

Average Response Rates








Average Attendance Rates

Total Average Attendance Rate: 77%






Interactions Between AIT and MySTN Members

A MySTN member may have more than one interaction if they participated in more than one meeting or survey.


• For example, 273 unique MySTN members have interacted with AIT a total of 908 times for group and individual consultations.
