As a committee member, your work strengthens and builds the well-recognized, industry-driven foundation of Alberta's apprenticeship and industry training system.

The network of industry committees includes:

Local Apprenticeship Committees

Local Apprenticeship Committees (LACs) provide a local perspective on activities and issues facing apprentices, journeypersons and employers in their trade or occupation. They are the grassroots of the system, providing recommendations to Provincial Apprenticeship Committees.

Provincial Apprenticeship Committees

Provincial Apprenticeship Committees (PACs) represent the trade across the province and are the link between LACs and the Alberta Apprenticeship and Industry Training Board. PACs consult their respective LACs and make recommendations to the Board on course outlines, trade exams, training and on the designation of trades and occupations under the Apprenticeship and Industry Training Act.

Occupational Committees

Occupational committees recommend competency and certification standards in designated occupations to the Alberta Apprenticeship and Industry Training Board.

Timing Matters

Noting a need in their area, a Local Apprenticeship Committee's recommendation resulted in an adjustment to the trade's technical training schedule to better meet the needs of local apprentices and employers.

Speed of Change

A Provincial Apprenticeship Committee's suggestions for improvements to address the speed of technological change led to the creation of individualized and up-to-date learning materials.

Practical Improvements

Recognizing a need for practical projects in the technical training program, a Local Apprenticeship Committee put forward a recommendation resulting in practical projects being implemented in the trade's first and second periods of technical training.
